## **Updates from TLA-ET**

May 3: From the grant received from Good Books Educational Trust (GBET) Ranchi, TLA-ET bought all the necessary stationary items and distributed to the children of the HFC Tuition Centre children. As all the nineteen children belong to poor families, they were very happy and excited to receive.





May 24-28: Pastors and Leaders Training Program Level-I

was organized by TLA-ET in SVD House, Guwahati. 32 Pastors from the states of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur and Nagaland attended. Various sessions were offered on the topics like The Art of Interpreting; Spiritual For-

mation; Pastoral Counselling; Inductive Bible Study and Mobile Production was taken up. The resource persons were Dr. A.K. Lama; Rev. Boipu Serto; Dr. Asangla Ao; Mr. Jerry Lapang and Mr. Bendangmeren T Aier.

Imsiichila Pongen, one of the participants commented, "Unlike the other training that I had attended so far, the subject never went off-track, it always gave the total focus on developing the skills that needed improvement. In every session there was learning."



TLA Land Update:

- ⇒ The 2nd slab of the Director's Quarter is done. It took place on April 25.
- $\Rightarrow$  The preparation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> and the last slab is under progress. Plywood is casted and rods are laid and tied for the cement casting.
- The plinth of the TLA training center is completed. Left wing pillars are erected. And Slab Casting has resumed from June 14 onwards.
- The TLA Land road construction for transporting trucks to the building site has been completed on May 10. 2022.
- Earth filling on the left wing is completed with 110 Truck



## **Updates from HFC**



**June 21:** *IVth Graduation* was held for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> batch of Tailoring Trainees under HFC Tailoring Training Centre. Total 20 candidates got admitted and 6 of them dropped out. Total 14 of them could appeared in the examination held and received their completion certificates. Mrs. Gitanjali Borah Dey from *Elizabeth Home* was the Guest of Honor.

June 21-24: Training on Report Writing & Documentation for Community Development Workers (CDWs) was held in Jehenabad & Patna respectively. It was facilitated by Communication Research Officers of GBET, Ranchi and HFC Guwahati. In Jehenabad, 12 CDWS and Project Manager attended and in Patna 13

CDWs attended it. The CROs took the opportunity to visit the 6 Tuition Centres run by the CDWs. This has helped the CROs to understand the field area, their work and challenges too. After the observation and feedback, they



are planning to take up more trainings which will enhance the CDWs to work effectively in the community.

The Project Manager of Jehanabad commented, "Many thanks to both of you for coming to Jehanabad and giving training. All the CDWs have learnt to write in a very simple and easy way. Everyone writes reports from before but it was not



right. After the training, people learned to write well and I also learned how we can write any testimony or story which can be easily understood by the readers. Both of you also visited the tuition centers and gave advice on documentation. I hope that there will be such training in future which will be beneficial for us."

**June 27:** The flood situation in Assam remained grim, taking the death toll to 135. HFC could collect clothes from family and friends and distributed to the families affected by the flood.
